### Xiju Film "The Poetry of a Gale" Nominated for Golden Rooster Award

The Xiju film *The Pearl Pagoda*, in which he starred, was nominated for Best Opera Film at the 32nd China Golden Rooster Awards.





Renowned as the "Prince of Xiju," Zhou is praised for his resonant and expressive voice, superbly nuanced acting, and elegant stage presence. With a wide artistic range, he excels not only in the stylized performance traditions of classic repertoire but also in boldly exploring innovation in new works. In doing so, he has helped Xiju remain rooted in tradition while continually revitalizing itself, making him a defining figure of contemporary Xiju.

In *The Poetry of a Gale*, Zhou Dongliang plays Emperor Gaozu of Han, Liu Bang. Not only does he demonstrate the unique charm of Xiju music through his richly nuanced singing, but he also employs his profound acting skills to delve into the complex psyche of an emperor torn between political strategy and personal loyalty. Zhou's portrayal captures Liu Bang's grand ambition, suspicion, and eventual genuine emotion with layered depth and vivid authenticity.

He is joined by a stellar cast of Xiju masters, including Tang Da, Zhang Jinhua, Ji Chunyan, Jiang Gaosong, Sun Lijian, and Zhu Peng. The film centers on the intricate and subtle relationship between Liu Bang and his chancellor, Xiao He—a historically renowned pair of "wise ruler and virtuous minister." Rather than offering one-dimensional praise, the film delves into their conflicts in governance and personal sentiments, ultimately depicting how they overcome turmoil to achieve profound reconciliation. The narrative is tightly paced, with鲜明 conflicts, encompassing both thrilling court intrigues and subtle emotional exchanges, collectively composing a stirring and thought-provoking "*The Poetry of a Gale*."

### III. Director Liu Xuezhong: A Master Craftsman in Opera Film
